

# **VILLAGE OF WAKEMAN**

## **POLICE COMMITTEE MEETING: HELD MAY 17<sup>TH</sup> AT 9AM**

**COMMITTEE PRESIDENT:** NANCY DELONG, PRESIDING  
**PRESENT:** BEV STOBER, JOHN NOLAN, CHIEF HUNKER

### **FIRST TOPIC DISCUSSED:** PARKING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY (VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS)

COMMITTEE TALKED ABOUT THE NEED FOR AN ORDINANCE OR AT LEAST A SIMILAR ORDINANCE TO VERMILION'S ORDINANCE 452.18. ALL AGREED THAT THERE HAS TO BE AN ORDINANCE ADOPTED THAT MENTIONS ITEMS SUCH AS BOATS AND TRAILERS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY. (PLEASE SEE ATTACHED COPY OF THAT ORDINANCE). COMMITTEE DISCUSSED THE OPTIONS.

JOHN NOLAN MADE THE MOTION TO APPROVE, BEV STOBER SECONDED, 3 AYES.

### **SECOND TOPIC DISCUSSED:** SECURITY CAMERA SYSTEM FOR THE COMMUNITY PARK

COMMITTEE DISCUSSED OPTIONS FOR THE COMMUNITY PARK AND VARIOUS CAMERA SYSTEMS. CHIEF BROUGHT UP THE LAST QUOTE. ALL AGREED THAT THERE SHOULD SOME TYPE OF SURVEILLANCE IN THE PARK FOR BULK WATER AND DOG FECE. IT WILL BE BROUGHT UP TO COUNCIL.

### **THIRD TOPIC DISCUSSED:** REPLACING STOP SIGNS & NO PARKING SIGNS ON STREETS

JOHN NOLAN MENTIONED THAT HE HAD OBSERVED SOME FADED STOP SIGNS. CHIEF TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT HE WOULD MENTION IT TO THE STREET DEPT. NO PARKING SIGN PLACEMENT WAS ALSO DISCUSSED FOR FRANKLIN STREET, CHIEF ADVISED THAT HE WOULD TALK TO THE STREET DEPARTMENT ON THAT AS WELL.

### **VARIOUS ITEMS DISCUSSED:**

CHIEF RECEIVED A CERTIFICATE FROM THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE FOR THE DEPARTMENT BEING CONSIDERED " FIRST RESPONDERS " TO THE OPIATE EPIDEMIC.

CHIEF MENTIONED THE FISHING DERBY AND A SUBSIDIARY COMPANY THAT IS CALLED " WAKEMAN OUTDOORS". HE WILL BE REQUESTING A POSSIBLE DONATION. ALL OF THE PRODUCTS HAVE THE NAME " WAKEMAN " ON THEM.

CHIEF MENTIONED THE OHIO COLLABORATIVE REVIEW BOARD THAT HAD BEEN ESTABLISHED BY GOVERNOR KASICH IN 2013. IN ORDER TO BE CERTIFIED WITH THIS REVIEW BOARD THERE WERE MANY OBSTACLES THAT WERE REQUIRED TO BE OVERCOME. IT WAS MAINLY GEARED TOWARDS LARGER DEPARTMENT THAT WERE HAVING " USE OF FORCE " ISSUES AND HIRING DIFFICULTIES. MANY OF THE SMALLER POLICE DEPARTMENT HAVE TO STARTED TO STEP AWAY FROM THE COLLABORATIVE BECAUSE OF SOME OF THE NEW DEMANDS. CHIEF ADVISED THAT HE WAS GLAD THAT THE DEPARTMENT DID NOT GET INVOLVED IN THIS.

THE 2012 IMPALA, WHICH IS ON GOVDEALS.COM, IS UP TO AROUND \$1800. THE RESERVE TO BE MET IS \$2500.

CHIEF MENTIONED THAT THE GOLF CART HAD BEEN UTILIZED ON MAY 3<sup>RD</sup> AND 4<sup>TH</sup> FOR 2 OUTINGS WITH THE LOCAL SCHOOL CHILDREN.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSED THE ANEXATION OF THE RIVERVIEW TRAILER PARK AND THE REASONS FOR IT. ALL AGREED IT WOULD BE A VALUABLE ASSET.

NANCY DELONG BROUGHT UP AN OFFICER'S PAYROLL HOURS BEING OVER THE 32 HOUR CAP FOR ONE WEEK. CHIEF ADVISED THE COMMITTEE THAT THE OFFICER HAD TO BE CALLED IN AND COURT TIME PLAYED A FACTOR IN TAKING HIM OVER THE 32 HOUR MARK. CHIEF ADVISED HE IS TAKING FULL RESPONSIBILTY FOR THE OVERAGE. DELONG ADVISED THAT THIS NEEDS TO BE WATCHED. CHIEF AGREED.

THERE WERE VARIOUS POLICE CALLS DISCUSSED AND THE CHIEF ADVISED THAT HE WOULD LOOK INTO ANY DISCREPANCIES.

COMMITTEE WENT OVER 2018 WISH LISH AND THE CHIEF WAS ADVISED TO PURCHASE THE FEW ITEMS LEFT,SUCH AS AN IN-CAR CAMERA SYSTEM, BODY CAMERA, AND DIGITAL CAMERA.
